Homework	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Practice</li> <li>Review</li> <li>Practice</li> <li>Reinforcement</li> <li>Practice</li> <li>Check for understanding</li> <li>Practice</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assigned every class.</li> <li>Worth 10 points.</li> <li>Due at beginning of class.</li> </ul> <p><b>Grading:</b>  <b>0 - 2</b> = Incomplete or barely complete  <b>3 - 4</b> = Mostly incomplete, student needs help  <b>5 - 6</b> = Half complete, student needs help, many issues  <b>7 - 8</b> = Mostly complete, mostly correct  <b>9 - 10</b> = Totally complete, solid understanding, majority correct</p>	20%
Projects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>You get to play with the language.</li> <li>You get to explore culture.</li> <li>You get to apply what you are learning to something creative, realistic and relevant.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assigned in class, worked on in class, completed at home.</li> <li>Some group projects, some individual projects</li> </ul> <p><b>Grading:</b>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I will provide a rubric for each project to explain how it will be graded.</li> </ul> </p>	20%
Participation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To <b>learn</b> French you have to <b>use</b> French.</li> <li>Participating helps you to <b>master</b> what we are working on.</li> <li>We are a community of learners and we all need to work together to make our time meaningful and worthwhile.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Daily Participation Points</b>  You begin every class with <b>10 participation points</b>. You lose <b>1 point</b> for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Coming to class without your book</li> <li>Coming to class without your binder</li> <li>Borrowing a pen or pencil</li> <li>Every time you speak in <i>any language other than French</i> during <i>speaking activities</i></li> </ul> <p><b>General Participation</b>  You will also receive a participation grade <b>twice a quarter</b> that reflects if you participate in answering questions, if you are engaged during class, if you are focused and on task, etc.</p>	20%
Classwork/ Warm Ups	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Because French is awesome.</li> </ul>	<p><b>Classwork</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assigned throughout the quarter.</li> <li>Usually written assignments (either worksheets or writing tasks).</li> <li>Turned in for grading (based on completion &amp; accuracy)</li> </ul> <p><b>Warm Ups</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Warm up activities assigned daily (first thing you do when you get to class)</li> <li>An answer key is provided and it is <b>your responsibility</b> to correct your work.</li> <li>Warm ups <u>will be collected for a grade two times every quarter</u>; it is <b>your responsibility</b> to keep track of your warm ups in your binder until they are due.</li> </ul>	20%
Tests/Quizzes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To find out how much you are learning.</li> <li>To see what might need more practice.</li> <li>To make sure that you are keeping up, getting the help you need and progressing in class.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There are different types of quizzes throughout the year: vocabulary, verb conjugation, and lesson quizzes.</li> <li>You will also take unit tests.</li> <li>You will have a final exam each quarter. It will be factored into your test/quizzes grade.</li> </ul>	20%
