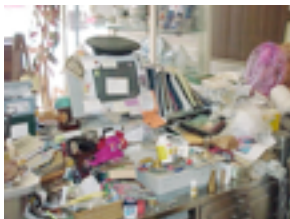

Worth 5 points. Correction key is provided & students job is to correct own work by circling or underlining mistakes & making the correction next to it. <p>Grading: The ONLY possible grades are 5, 3.5, & 0</p> <p>5 homework is on time & clearly corrected from answer key</p> <p>3.5 homework late/incomplete & completed during class; student also completed missing homework form</p> <p>0 homework assignment is not complete or has not been corrected by student</p>	20%
Projects	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> You get to play with the language. You get to explore culture. Participation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To learn French you have to use French. Participating helps you to master what we are working on. We are a community of learners and we all need to work together to make our time meaningful and worthwhile. 	<p>Daily Participation Points</p> <p>You begin every class with 10 participation points. You lose 1 point for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Coming to class without your book Coming to class without your binder Borrowing a pen or pencil Every time you speak in <i>any language other than French</i> during <i>speaking activities</i> <p>General Participation</p> <p>You will also receive a participation grade twice a quarter that reflects if you participate in answering questions, if you are engaged during class, if you are focused and on task, etc.</p>	20%
Classwork/ Warm Ups	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Because French is awesome. 	<p>Classwork</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Assigned throughout the quarter. Usually written assignments (either worksheets or writing tasks). Turned in for grading (based on completion & accuracy) <p>Warm Ups</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Warm up activities assigned daily (first thing you do when you get to class) An answer key is provided and it is your responsibility to correct your work. Warm ups <u>will be collected for a grade two times every quarter</u>; it is your responsibility to keep track of your warm ups in your binder until they are due. 	20%
Tests/Quizzes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To find out how much you are learning. To see what might need more practice. To make sure that you are keeping up, getting the help you need and progressing in class. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> There are different types of quizzes throughout the year: vocabulary, verb conjugation, and lesson quizzes. You will also take unit tests. You will have a final exam each quarter. It will be factored into your test/quizzes grade. 	20%

Important: How To Be Prepared & Organized

- ➡ Keep an organized binder.
- ➡ Keep track of important dates.
- ➡ Write down assignments when they are given.
- ➡ Ask for help when you need it!



Classeur (Binder)

• **Each student is required to keep an organized binder for this class.**

• Based on the work we will be doing, I would like you to have the following sections clearly labelled in your binder:

1. Échauffements (Warm Ups)

- This section is where you keep your daily warm ups.

2. Reprise des Notes et Polycopiés (Notes & Photocopies)

- This section is where you keep notes and classwork.
- This section is also where you keep any photocopies/handouts (except for vocabulary lists, which go in the vocabulaire section).

3. Vocabulaire (Vocabulary)

- This section is where you keep vocabulary lists.

4. Verbes (Verbs)

- This section is where you keep verb charts.

5. Les Devoirs (Homework)

- This is the section where you put your homework when it is finished and when it is returned with a grade.

• By keeping an organized binder, you are able to:

- easily reference the work you have done, the notes you have taken and the handouts you have received.
- easily find assignments that are due and you know where your homework is.

• To help keep track of your work, be sure to:

- always write the date on papers you receive and work you do.
- put the work in the appropriate section of the binder *right when you are done* working with it
- keep papers chronologically (based dates) and always put new papers at the beginning of each section



Your Planner

• Each student is expect to bring your planner to class every day.

• Use your planner to:

- Write down your homework assignments;
- Write important due dates;
- Write phone numbers & e-mail addresses of classmates;
- Count down to vacations!

Guided Study

• Use guided study as an opportunity to catch up on your organization!

• Take 5 - 10 minutes to:

- Review upcoming due dates;
- Put away those random papers that got shoved in your book, your backpack, the front pocket of your binder, etc.
- Make sure you have your homework assignments written down & ask someone if you forgot something!
